StudentAid.gov Account Publications

Students and parents must each create a [StudentAid.gov account](#) to access and sign the FAFSA. To make the process simple, use our [StudentAid.gov Account Worksheet](#) — available in both English and Spanish — for step-by-step guidance.

Be sure to store your completed worksheet in a safe place. You'll use your StudentAid.gov account every year to sign your FAFSA and manage your financial aid information.

Not sure which parent needs to create an account? Check out our [Who Needs a StudentAid.gov Account?](#) worksheet to find out whether one or both parents should set up an account.

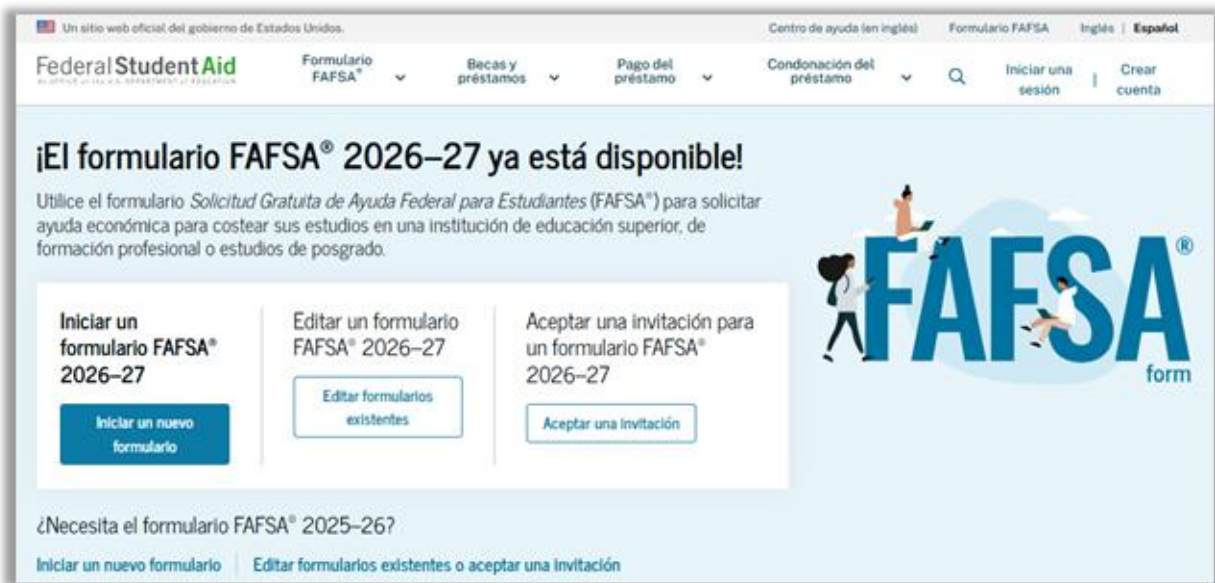
